

**GREAT BRITAIN FIELD ARCHERY TEAM SELECTION CRITERIA
FOR THE
WORLD FIELD ARCHERY CHAMPIONSHIPS, 2010**

Archers wishing to be considered for the Great Britain Field Team for 2010 will be required to complete a minimum of FOUR, two-day FITA 24 shoots in the period between the end of the 2009 All British & Open and finish of the All British & Open 2010. Only the scores from completed two-day tournaments will be considered. Both combined and double mixed rounds will be considered.

In addition to Record Status combined or mixed tournaments within Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the selectors will consider a maximum of two scores from tournaments outside Great Britain and Northern Ireland, provided that these are shot at two day FITA 24 Arrowhead Status events. All Rounds must comply with the FITA Rules in Book 1, Article 4.5.3.7 for the Unmarked and Article 4.5.3.8 for the Marked Round. For tournaments outside Great Britain and Northern Ireland, it is the responsibility of the individual archer to supply an official result sheet to the selectors. Scores shot outside Great Britain and Northern Ireland after the 23rd May 2010 will not be considered.

Scores from European, and World Championships and World Games will be accepted without proof of individual archer's scores.

Score levels for archers seeking selection for the 2010 World Championship Team.

Ladies barebow:	Minimum 3 scores equal to or greater than 507 and a 4 score aggregate equal to or greater than 2028
Gents barebow:	Minimum 3 scores equal to or greater than 600 and a 4 score aggregate equal to or greater than 2400
Ladies recurve:	Minimum 3 scores equal to or greater than 587 and a 4 score aggregate equal to or greater than 2348
Gents recurve:	Minimum 3 scores equal to or greater than 669 and a 4 score aggregate equal to or greater than 2676
Ladies compound:	Minimum 3 scores equal to or greater than 727 and a 4 score aggregate equal to or greater than 2908
Gents compound:	Minimum 3 scores equal to or greater than 785 and a 4 score aggregate equal to or greater than 3140

E & OE.

The selectors will consider no more than two scores from tournaments in the first selection period between the end of the 2009 All British & Open and 31st December 2009. Archers must shoot a minimum of two scores in the second selection period between 1st January 2010 and the finish of the All British & Open 2010.

The selectors will require archers wishing to be considered for selection to complete and submit scores from one of the following nominated venues as one of their four scores. This score may be shot at any time in either selection period.

Southern England:	Overton
South Wales:	Pentref

West Wales: Carmarthen
Northern Kendal
England: or Cheshire
Northern Ireland: Castlewellan or Tollymore

Note: The selectors cannot guarantee that all these venues will be used during either selection period and it is the archer's responsibility to submit a score from one of these tournaments.

Scores will only be considered twice from the same venue if the scores were shot in different calendar years, i.e. scores from the autumn Welsh Championship 2009 at Pentref could be used in conjunction with the scores from the Pentref's Spring Shoot 2010. The score from the 2010 All British Championship may be used, irrespective of venue. If a venue is used twice during the same calendar year for two day competitions, the only score which will be considered is that from the first tournament the archer shoots, irrespective of whether he or she completes the shoot.

Archers equalling or exceeding the required score levels will be considered for selection, which will be guided by comparison of the aggregate of each archer's highest four scores during the selection period. Archers are reminded that one of the scores must be shot at one of the nominated venues detailed above.

In any discipline and division where aggregate scores are similar, the selectors will look at each archer's highest scores in 2010, together with the best score from the list of nominated venues. Preference may be shown to archers with demonstrably superior performance during 2010.

Junior archers wishing to be considered are not required to meet the adult qualifying criteria, but would be expected to shoot at least one score at, or very close to, the adult qualifying standard.

In the event that no archer reaches the qualifying standard in a particular discipline or division, the selectors may offer a place to the highest placed archer in that discipline in order to ensure team representation. This will be at the discretion of the selectors based on the scores shot during the qualifying period.
